NONVOTERS: People who didn't vote. What do the results say to them? ASSIGN

LAWYERS: Find the lawyers that the campaigns have on the ground and standing by to file legal papers at the courthouses.

POLL WORKERS: Interviews with poll workers, voters, campaign officials.

SWITCH VOTERS: People who voted opposite of what they normally do. Republicans who went Democrat, Democrats who went Republican.

CONGRESS: staff the offices of a couple of Congress members and report on the calls and traffic they are getting. Probably best to do field offices. Or, it could be local representative offices, city council members, county council members, etc.

TURNOUT: What can we know on Nov. 4 about votes already cast and, what do the mid-day returns look like in jurisdictions that do mid-days. Interviews with volunteer poll workers
